
ISSofBC new video project for refugee claimants

Hi all,

As we all know, low income seniors and other vulnerable groups living in Victoria-Fraserview, Killarney and Sunset struggle to find access to free or low-cost food in their neighbourhood. Since COVID-19 started, the Greater Vancouver Food Bank closed their distribution site in Victoria-Fraserview and relocated to Mount Pleasant. The new site is difficult for seniors, persons with disabilities, and families with young children to access. SVNH stepped in to offer temporary emergency food distribution which has now ended due to limited space.

There is a gap in access to emergency food for low income seniors and other vulnerable groups in South Vancouver. As a result of this food challenge the South Vancouver Seniors Hub Council has taken the lead on an online petition to help increase awareness of the food insecurity that exists in South Vancouver. **Please sign the petition below by clicking on the link.** Share this with your contacts and help our neighbours' voices be heard.



Some of the BCP changes for this coming year brought about by COVID-19 and our adaptation to virtual, remote learning include smaller group size, later start to projects and no requirement for original research.
