## **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES WITH MAP**

**Volunteer Interpreters – please pass this opportunity along to your clients with language skills – certification unnecessary.**

Under MAP coordination five member agencies will begin supporting the non-legal needs of detainees at the Surrey Immigration Holding Centre (IHC). Providing support by phone each client will have an initial interview and in many cases we will need interpreters. We are looking for volunteer interpreters with any language capacity, but especially Punjabi, Hindi, Spanish, French, Arabic, and Cantonese/Mandarin.

If you have some experience interpreting (but you don't need to be certified) and would like to volunteer your help on Thursday afternoons, from 1pm – 4pm once or twice a month we would appreciate hearing from you.

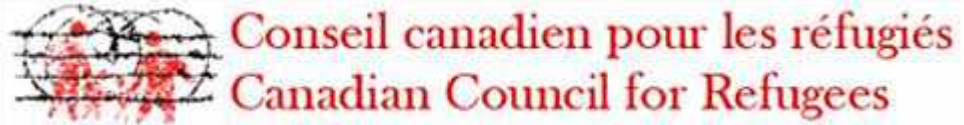

## SURVIVOR ADVOCATES CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAM

*Spring 2022*

**WHAT:** An experiential-based learning program that will focus on advocacy themes, advocacy skills, and opportunities to engage in advocacy work in the community.

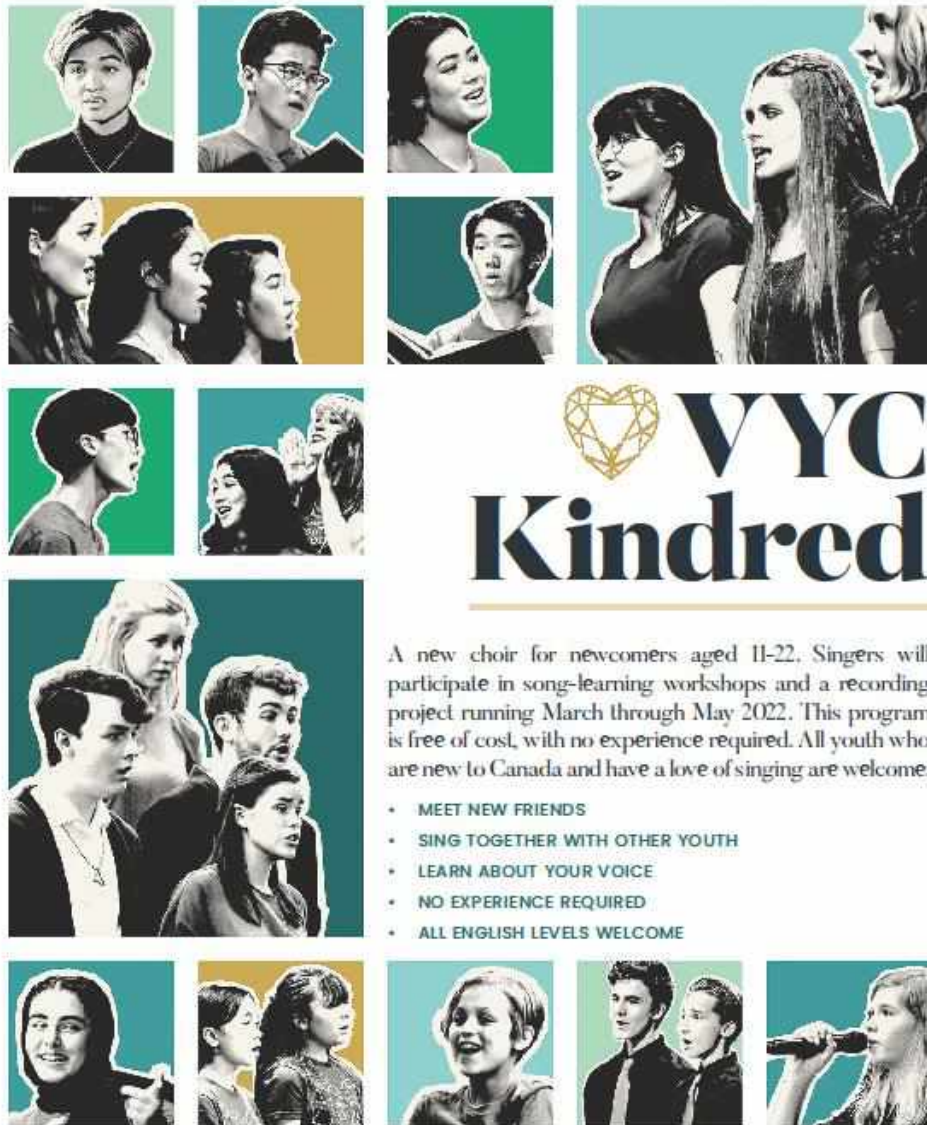

**Description:** Join us as Statistics Canada's Quality Secretariat will give a presentation on the importance of data quality. We are living in an exciting time for data: sources are more abundant, they are being generated in innovative ways, and they are available quicker than ever. However, a data source is not only worthless if it does not meet basic quality standards – it can be misleading, and worse than having no data at all!

Statistics Canada's Quality Secretariat has a mandate to promote good quality practices within the agency, across the Government of Canada, and internationally. For quality to truly be present, it must be incorporated into each process (from design to analysis) and into the product itself – whether that product is a microdata file or estimates derived from it.

We will address why data quality is important and how one can evaluate it in practice. We will cover some basic concepts in data quality (quality assurance vs. control, metadata, etc.), and present data quality as a multidimensional concept. Finally, we will show data quality in action by evaluating a data source together. All data quality literacy levels are welcome. After all, everybody plays a part in quality!
